

## THE LOW INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

is designed to assist income-qualified households pay for winter energy services. LIHEAP provides benefits to be used for energy bills. The amount of payments are determined by income, household size, fuel type and geographic location. This program is funded by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

Applications are accepted Nov. 1- Jan. 31 at Community Action agencies

### 3 TYPES OF ENERGY ASSISTANCE OFFERED BY LOCAL AGENCIES:

- LIHEAP (one-time payment)
- Emergency Heating Assistance
- Weatherization Assistance

Eligibility is determined by the current year's poverty guidelines.
