

# THE LOW INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

is designed to assist eligible low-income households pay for energy services. The amount paid is determined by income, number of residents in a household, heating fuel source and geographical location. The U.S. Department of Health and Human services funds LIHEAP.

**Applications** are accepted Oct. 1 - Mar. 31 at Community Action agencies

## 3 TYPES OF ENERGY ASSISTANCE OFFERED **BY LOCAL AGENCIES:**

- LIHEAP (one-time payment)
- Crisis Heating Assistance
- Weatherization Assistance Program

Eligibility is determined by the current year's Federal poverty guidelines.
